**RESPONSIBLE GROWTH FOR NORTHCROSS TO RALLY
COMMUNITY AT TOWN HALL MEETING, JAN. 31, 2007**

*Citizens Gathering To Discuss Opposition To
Lincoln Property Company's Plans for Wal-Mart Supercenter*

AUSTIN, Texas, Jan. 29, 2007 — Responsible Growth for Northcross (RG4N), the group opposing construction plans at Northcross Mall by Dallas-based Lincoln Property Company, which include a colossal Wal-Mart Supercenter, will hold an important community meeting on January 31, 2007.

More than 500 citizens are expected to gather Wednesday evening at 7 p.m. in Wozniak Hall at St. Louis Catholic Church at 7601 Burnet Road.

RG4N will be making several significant announcements, including plans for a major RG4N event unlike anything Austin has ever seen.

Also at the meeting, RG4N will update the local community about its steps to stop Dallas-based Lincoln Property Company, and to preserve the quality of life, safety, residential characteristics and property values of the neighborhoods that would be impacted by the current redevelopment plans at Northcross.

Everyone is welcome. Residents living in the Allandale, Brentwood, Crestview, North Shoal Creek, Rosedale and Wooten neighborhoods are especially encouraged to attend.
